Press Communiqué

Shillong, May 10, 2025 : In a significant show of unity, the Hon'ble Governor of Meghalaya, Shri C.H. Vijayashankar, has called upon members from All Faiths from the state to come together in a spirit of unity and solidarity with the nation.

The meeting, held in Raj Bhavan, Shillong, witnessed participation from representatives of several prominent religious organizations, including Shri Nabha Bhattacharya - Vice President of Meghalaya All Faiths Forum and President of Central Pooja Committee, Shillong, Rev.
