#### **Press Communiqué**

**21<sup>st</sup> January 2026, Shillong :** Today, Lok Bhavan, Meghalaya, celebrated the Statehood/Foundation Day of **Meghalaya, Manipur, Tripura, Uttar Pradesh, Dadra & Nagar Haveli, and Daman & Diu** in a solemn and vibrant ceremony marked by cultural pride and the spirit of national unity.

The event was graced by Shri C.H.Vijayashankar, the Hon'ble Governor of Meghalaya as Chief Guest, Shri Wailadmiiki Shylla, Hon'ble Minister of Minister for Health and Family Welfare, Government of Meghalaya, Shri H.C.Chaudhary, Principal Secretary to the Governor, Padma Shri awardee Shri Manas Choudhury Journalist and Former Education Minister in Government of Meghalaya, Padma Shri Smt.
